“Could the Committee commit some time to proactive planning as well as reactive consideration of peoples applications? To be more specific, please commission a work’s party to enable good data on the perceived wants / needs for “affordable” housing for beginners, low wage earners, and downsizers? Presumably outside the current village boundary that will need to be re-drawn.” Mr Allott also verbally raised concerns that he is unable to understand the Stroud District Council Emerging Local Plan.

The Chairman, Cllr Rob Lewis responded with the following statement:

“Painswick’s Planning Committee and its Officers already spend a considerable amount of time covering all points that you have mentioned. Each year we spend time meeting with the Stroud LPA’s Strategic Planning Committee to have direct input into the Emerging Local Plan.

We also feedback local comments that come via Councillors and at numerous open meetings.

We have worked extremely closely on the upcoming Emerging Plan and have met as a working party with local residents to detail and discuss our input particularly the Lower Washwell development.

Painswick is a gold standard Parish Council – something we would not have achieved without the excellent efforts of all of our Councillors – not just in attending meetings.

All of the work we and the Officer do is clearly communicated and detailed on our website and in the Painswick Beacon.”
